Mrs. Johnnie Jackson was born around 1924. She was a graduate of the historic Randolph County Training School. It is believed that she attended and graduated from Tuskegee Institute. She lived most of her life in the historic East Roanoke Community with her husband the late, Mr. Jessie C. (aka J.C.) Jackson, with whom she operated a neighborhood eatery called "Jackson's Nik-Nak-Nook." Jackson's Nic-Nak-Nook was a popular place with people throughout the community. And through their eatery, Mrs. Jackson hosted meetings of the CIVIC-SO-LEAGUE.

At age 77, Mrs. Jackson Passed away peacefully on September 17, 2001 in LaFayette, Chambers County, Alabama.
